
Lodging Information

Alpine On-Snow Clinics:

Precision and Versatility: Using ideas drawn from Lateral Learning and the Teaching Fundamentals, we will collaborate on interesting and fun ways to develop our Skiing Fundamentals. Day one will focus on developing your skiing. Starting from a basic short radius turn, we will be experiencing how intentionally modifying the task creates precision and versatility in our skiing. Day two will focus on how to structure training sessions at your home resort by using the Teaching Fundamentals to modify Skiing IDP tasks for instructor development.

RMT Workshop

*This course is for those currently in the RMT Process. RMT candidates will spend 2 days on snow with qualified Rocky Mountain Ed staff developing skills in MA/technical knowledge, clinic leading and skiing to pursue and succeed in Rocky Mountain Trainer accreditation.

Alpine Examiner 1 Development: *You must be a current RMT to attend this event. If you are a current RMT and considering applying to be an Examiner, check out this 2-day clinic to enhance your ability to structure training sessions using the Learning Connection Model. We will work on making statements that refer to PSIA concepts and create clear, effective, and tangible training outcomes, adapting Learning Activities and Experiences to the needs of the people in your group, using IDP tasks and modifying them to emphasize specific Skiing Fundamentals and Skill Blends as well as engaging group members in meaningful two-way interactions that enhance the learning environment.

Freestyle Alpine and Snowboard On-Snow Clinics:

How to Train for the Freestyle Specialist Credential: In this session, you will be exposed to training methods and practices for getting your Instructors into a freestyle mindset, from drills and tactics to the overview of the newly developed "freestyle Experience Log" as well as exploring the unification of the national freestyle standard & updates to the process of the exams and training products. *This clinic will be offered as 2 separate groups, Alpine & Snowboard.

Supervisor Skills Workshop

The transition from individual contributor to leader is one of the most difficult and challenging times in anyone's career. With the seasonality and nature of the resort business, many new supervisors and managers learn their new roles by trial and error. This 3-day workshop is designed to reduce the learning curve and help new supervisors, managers, and team leaders be successful sooner and with less stress and anxiety.

Snowboard On-Snow Clinics:

What's Up with Snowboard: This Resort Trainer and Manager focused version of the Certification Update clinic will cover the changes to Snowboard Levels 1, 2, 3 and RMT process. On snow, attendees will discuss current and future changes to exam format and tasks, ride through new and changed tasks, experience the new MA format, and learn more about the current format of L2 and L3 Teaches. Participants will gain a better understanding of the current exam candidate experience and how to better prepare and train instructors for exams. Day 1 will focus on curriculum updates for Levels 1-3, while day 2 will focus on Level 3 and RMT. As time allows we will dive into tactics for delivering compelling training and designing an environment for professional learning.

This session is ideally suited to those who currently train new and returning instructors, and resort managers who would like a better understanding of how Snowboard Certification has evolved. Alpine participants are welcome. This may be taken as a one-day or two-day session.

Children's Multi Discipline On-Snow Clinics:

CSI Teaching Scenario/Performance: How to up your/your schools/your staff's performance for this key CSI component. Explanation of score card, real time selection of teach topics, planning, and performance of teaches, and feedback. Walk the walk and learn! Open scoring of scenarios, transparency is key.

CS2 Teaching Performance: How to up your/your schools/your staff's performance for the long teach. Explanation of score card, development of comprehension of cards, real time mini teaches with feedback. Open scoring, transparency of standards and evaluation is key.

*We'll provide updates to RM's Children's Hiring pathway and insight into the hiring process, as well as answer any other questions about the Children's world of PSIA-RM-AASI.

Pathway to CETT: Candidates will spend 1 day on snow building awareness of their strengths and areas of growth with respect to CETT skills set. Participants will work through a few of the following topics: intentionally shifting along presentation to facilitation when clinicing, leading conceptual content to peer audiences, sliding on snow is the bottom line (CAP helps us teach SKIING and SNOWBOARDING), and the basics of standard based evaluation.
